

## Kathryn Brown Award

This award is presented annually to the Cub Scout of Pack 320 who demonstrates the highest levels of Faith, Compassion, and Perseverance, as well as a strong overall contribution to the pack and/or den. Scouts may be evaluated based on general patterns of behavior, or by particular events during which the scout demonstrates the character traits.

This award was created in 2007 in recognition of Kathryn H. Brown's thirty-nine years of outstanding service to Cub Scout Pack 320, as well as modeling the twelve Core Values of Cub Scouting, particularly **FAITH** in God, **COMPASSION** for all children and those in need, and **PERSEVERANCE** in times of hardship and difficulty.

The patch is designed around the Arrow constellation (3rd smallest of the internationally recognized 88 constellations) and the Fleur-de-lis (a lily, the emblem of peace and purity.) Both features are significant in Boys Scout culture: the Arrow of Light being the highest award a Cub Scout can earn and the Fleur-de-lis being the official scout symbol.
